

## Soundproofist's noise checklist

## For renting or buying a new home

Building age / modifications	Floors
What year was it built?	Wood / laminate / concrete?
Was it obviously remodeled?	Carpeting?
Single or double-paned windows?	Are floors noisy?
Ceiling height:	Exterior hall carpeting?:
Appliance age:	Any underlayment (i.e. cork?):
Walls	Neighborhood
Shared walls?	Dense or open space?
Insulated or hollow?	Traffic noise?
Plaster or drywall?	Near transit station?
Can you hear traffic?:	Bars / restaurants?:
Decibel test:	Mid-block or on corner?:
Should be about 35 dB when no one is talking in the room.	You might get more traffic noise at a corner from car acceleration.
Watch out for:	Be sure to check:
Ceiling fans	Any noise maps for the area
Recessed lights	Flight paths from airport
Vibration from HVAC, heat pumps, etc.	Proximity of neighbor's balconies
Elevator noise	Truck or school loading zones
Noise "tunnels" (air shafts, etc.)	Location of fire house, ER (for sirens)
